

Ross Township Campus Building - Frequently Asked Questions



Where are we in the building process for the Ross Township Campus building?

We have been working closely with our design-builders, Aspen Group, to determine layout, square footage, parking, and entrance from US 27. We want to make sure that we are getting a functional building with the beauty, grace, and roominess to accomplish our ministry goals. The elders want to remain aggressive with our building timeline while balancing our financial parameters.

What are some of the essentials in this building?

We plan for an auditorium that will seat 300. We are building children and student spaces that will accommodate 150 in each service. Children's safety and check-in are maximized in our gathering places. We have planned a large foyer for gathering and conversations with comfortable seating and, of course, coffee. The design allows for spaces to have multiple uses such as office and meeting spaces. Of course, restrooms will be throughout the structure. Our desire is for this building to be a place where the community can come and get to know Jesus as well as a place that will help to mobilize God's people to take Jesus to the community.

When will ground be broken on the property?

We are working with a calendar that should allow for ground breaking in the summer of 2020.

How long will construction last?

We are planning for construction to take 10-12 months.

How will the building be built?

We will use a pre-engineered steel building which allows us to develop an exterior look that will be eye-pleasing and bring glory and honor to the Lord. We will also build so that expansion will be relatively easy when future needs require it.

What happens next?

We are continuing to be pleased by the response to our Cannonball Generosity Initiative. In order to build this building with minimal loans required, we need each person to faithfully respond in generous giving and timely offerings. We will be celebrating the completion of the public phase of Cannonball on May 17, 2020. We are praying that each of us have developed a Cannonball lifestyle where we Jump In! and Make Waves!
